PRESCHOOL CURRICULUM

The past three weeks we've been studying about backyard birds. We've looked at pictures of birds and talked about bird behaviors such as migration, pruning, molting, laying eggs, and building nests. We also discussed how not all birds can fly and what birds eat. We heard and learned to imitate and discriminate various bird calls as well as making bird feeders and our own suet. 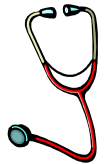
SCHOOL PICTURES
